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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

The second quarter of the year has seen some local and international engagements by MAESCO whilst it continues to spearhead training activities for entities required to comply with the new Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act. Activities carried out during this period reflect the realisation of MAESCO's vision to become a reference point not only at the national level but also at the regional level.

On the international front, the International Finance Corporation under the World Bank organised an online webinar titled 'Sustainable Cooling in Malaysia'. Another significant international milestone was the formalisation of the Asia Pacific ESCO Industry Alliance (APEIA), where MAESCO was designated with the portfolio of Knowledge Sharing. Coincidentally, after this, we were invited by the Government of Indonesia through the ASEAN Centre for Energy (ACE) to conduct a workshop together with our Thailand counterpart to initiate the development of the ESCO industry in Indonesia. We also received a courtesy visit to our office from an event organiser from Thailand to specially invite MAESCO members to a major energy event and exhibition in Bangkok, where accommodation will be fully sponsored by the event host.

Similarly, at the national level, there were two significant events. The first was that MAESCO was invited to a workshop as the only non-governmental stakeholder, chaired by the Ministry of Economy (MOE), to review the progress of the energy efficiency initiatives under the National Energy Transition Roadmap. The main issue discussed was how to facilitate the launch of the ESCO platform for a major programme to retrofit Government buildings, which is currently facing delays despite industry players being ready to support the initiative. MOE is committed to ensuring that this initiative is realised. The second was that, following a few preliminary online discussions, MAESCO was honoured to receive high-level dignitaries from the Ministry of Energy and Environmental Sustainability Sarawak (MEESTy) and the Ministry of Utility & Telecommunication Sarawak (MUT), with the intention of the Sarawak State Government collaborating with MAESCO to develop local expertise and ESCOs to facilitate compliance with newly introduced state legislation. This will augur well for MAESCO's accredited trainers and offer potential joint venture opportunities with local partners for MAESCO members to undertake energy efficiency projects.

With the ongoing efforts undertaken by MAESCO through its committee members across all fronts of the energy efficiency ecosystem, it is hoped that these initiatives will benefit members not only through the business opportunities they offer but also by fostering greater collaboration amongst members.

Report:

MAESCO engaged in a discussion with the International Finance Corporation (IFC), a subsidiary of World Bank represented by Ms. Aditi Shrestha, Senior Investment Officer of IFC to explore potential collaboration opportunities in advancing sustainable cooling solutions in Malaysia. The session focused on the growing importance of cooling as a key driver of energy demand and its role in climate mitigation and adaptation efforts.

During the discussion, IFC shared insights on global sustainable cooling initiatives, including key intervention areas such as district cooling systems, energy-efficient technologies, cold chain logistics, and sustainable cooling for buildings. The conversation also highlighted opportunities within the Malaysian context, particularly in enhancing energy efficiency, reducing emissions, and supporting climate resilience.

Both parties agreed to co-organise a webinar titled “Sustainable Cooling in Malaysia” in June 2026, aimed at convening key stakeholders to promote resource-efficient technologies, share industry perspectives and explore capacity-building opportunities.

Report:

MAESCO was represented by Ir. Phang Chen Faut at the Kick-Off Meeting of the Working Group for the Development of Guidelines on Energy Efficiency Criteria and Rating for Data Centres under the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act (EECA) 2024. The meeting was organised by the Energy Commission (Suruhanjaya Tenaga) as part of its initiative to establish a comprehensive framework for assessing and rating energy efficiency performance in data centres.

During the session, participants were presented with the foundational reference framework that will serve as the basis for developing the guidelines. The framework is intended to provide a structured approach for defining data centre classification criteria, energy intensity measurement methodologies, and energy efficiency rating systems aligned with industry best practices and the operational characteristics of the sector. The meeting also outlined the proposed roadmap for the guideline development process, which includes technical discussions among working group members, stakeholder engagement sessions, preparation of draft guidelines, public consultation, and final approval by the relevant authorities. The overall development process is expected to span approximately two years before the guidelines are formally issued.

It is envisaged that in the very near future, MEESTy and MAESCO will be holding a workshop in Kuching as a preliminary step to investigate the current capacity of local tertiary and TVET institutions to carry out suitable related courses and for the purpose of developing ESCOs in the state. The workshop will also invite industrial players from the professional bodies, electrical association and mechanical & electrical contractors active in the state to be identified as potential ESCOs.

Report:

The workshop was chaired by Datuk Dr. Zunika binti Mohamed, Deputy Secretary General (Policy) of Ministry of Economy and co-chaired by Dr. Puteh Soraya A Rahman, Deputy Director of Energy Division. MAESCO was represented by Ar. Zulkifli Zahari.

The workshop was organised through the Malaysia Petroleum Resources Corporation (MPRC), an agency under Ministry of Economy as part of the ongoing assessment of the implementation and effectiveness of the National Energy Transition Roadmap (NETR).

The workshop brought together key stakeholders from government agencies and regulators. MAESCO was the only stakeholder invited to represent the EE industrial players. The intention of the workshop was to assess the progress of the EE initiatives under the NETR and to address challenges on why its progress is not as anticipated. Discussions focused on major initiatives under the energy efficiency pillar, including the implementation of the EECA 2024, mandatory energy audits, enhancement of Minimum Energy Performance Standards (MEPS), energy efficiency awareness programmes, the proposed ESCO platform, and large-scale energy retrofit programmes for government buildings. MAESCO provided a detail feedback report providing its views on issues and proposals to overcome the lack of progress in the EE initiatives of the NETR.

MAESCO was represented by Ir. Fadzil Shah at the 6th GreenRE Advisory Panel (GREAP) Meeting organised by GreenRE Malaysia. The annual meeting brought together over 20 organisations, including government agencies, regulators, professional institutions, developers, consultants, academia and NGOs to discuss developments in Malaysia's sustainable building and green growth agenda.

GreenRE highlighted its achievements over the past 12 years, including the certification of more than 500 million sq ft of green buildings and the expansion of its certification programmes across the region. The organisation also shared updates on its ongoing initiatives and strategic priorities for advancing sustainability in the built environment. The information-sharing session featured updates from PLANMalaysia on urban redevelopment, Suruhanjaya Tenaga (ST) on sustainability and energy efficiency regulations, UKM on GreenRE-funded residential certification research, UiTM on carbon market mechanisms and MGTC on the latest developments under the Green Technology Financing Scheme (GTFS).

MAESCO participated in the 8th Asia-Pacific ESCO Industry Alliance (APEIA) Meeting, held virtually with representatives from ESCO associations across the Asia-Pacific region. The meeting marked APEIA's first official gathering following its incorporation in Singapore on 30 March 2026.

During the meeting, members received updates on APEIA's governance structure, the proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the ASEAN Centre for Energy (ACE) and organisational developments, including the approval of membership fees and committee restructuring. MAESCO was appointed Chair of the Knowledge Management Committee, reinforcing Malaysia's leadership in regional knowledge sharing and capacity building for the ESCO industry.

The meeting also discussed upcoming international initiatives, including the 3rd International ESCO Symposium in Madrid (October 2026), the potential hosting of the 4th Symposium in Asia in 2027, and updates on ESCO market developments across the Asia-Pacific region.

The session was organised by Suruhanjaya Tenaga (ST) as part of its ongoing efforts to strengthen industry competency development in support of the implementation of the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act 2024 (EECA 2024).

The engagement session brought together representatives from key government agencies, professional bodies, industry associations, training institutions and Registered Energy Auditors to provide feedback on the proposed REA competency framework to develop a training program by the Energy Commission themselves. Discussions focused on the structure of the training programme, competency requirements, assessment methodologies, and the overall development of a structured pathway for energy auditors in Malaysia. During the session, it was proposed by president that should Energy Commission require trainers for the program, it should be through the associations such as MAESCO.

Zulkifli Zahari was invited as an international speaker representing MAESCO in Session 2: “Cracking the Bankability Issue: International Lessons for Scaling ESCOs.” His presentation, titled “Linking Certification to Finance,” highlighted Malaysia’s experience in developing the ESCO industry through structured registration and tiering mechanisms, as well as the linkage between ESCO certification and access to financing opportunities under the Green Technology Financing Scheme (GTFS). The session provided valuable insights into practical approaches for improving project bankability and demonstrated how government support, industry certification, and financing facilitation can work together to accelerate the growth of the ESCO industry and energy efficiency investments in the region.

MAESCO, represented by its President, Ar. The signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre on 3 June 2026 is to compliment the earlier MOU signed with MACRA primarily to facilitate industrial support towards implementation of the Energy Efficiency initiatives and Energy Performance Contracting (EPC) under the National Energy Transition Roadmap (NETR). The partnership seeks to leverage the strengths of both organisations in advancing energy-efficient lighting solutions and facilitating greater industry participation in large-scale retrofit projects. Through this MOU, MAESCO members participating in the EE initiatives in the NETR can leverage on support by MyCIE members for the purpose of technical, product warranty and facilitation of financing from local financial institutions for lighting retrofit projects. The MOU was signed between Ar. Zulkifli Zahari and Dato’ Dr. Siew Choon Thye, Chairman of MyCIE witnessed by the secretariat of respective organizations.

MAESCO was represented by Ir. Phang Chen Faut at the Working Group Meeting on the Development of Guidelines for Criteria and Energy Efficiency Rating of Data Centres under the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act (EECA) 2024 organised by the Energy Commission (Suruhanjaya Tenaga). The meeting brought together representatives from government agencies, professional bodies, industry associations, academia, and data centre operators to provide technical input for the development of Malaysia's data centre energy efficiency framework.

The discussions focused on establishing clear criteria for determining data centres under EECA 2024, including data centre classification, facility boundaries, and practical reference sources to support future regulatory implementation. Participants also exchanged views on the development of energy intensity performance indicators, with the Energy Commission emphasising that stakeholder feedback will be consolidated and used to refine the proposed guidelines in subsequent working group sessions. MAESCO remains committed to contributing its technical expertise in the development of practical energy efficiency policies and guidelines that support the sustainable growth of Malaysia's rapidly expanding data centre industry.

ACE Convenes ‘Scaling ESCO Intermediaries in ASEAN’ Workshop to Unlock Energy Efficiency Financing in Indonesia – 19-20 May 2025

The ASEAN Centre for Energy (ACE) convened the "Scaling ESCO Intermediaries in ASEAN" workshop in Jakarta on 19–20 May 2026 as part of the Energy Efficiency Investment and Business Forum. The event brought together over 90 participants from government, financial institutions, ESCOs, industry, and development partners to explore strategies for accelerating energy efficiency financing in Indonesia. Discussions focused on innovative financing mechanisms such as credit guarantees and Energy Savings Insurance (ESI), while regional experts from APEIA, the Thai ESCO Association, and MAESCO shared successful ESCO development models. MAESCO President Ar. Zulkifli Zahari presented Malaysia's experience in linking ESCO certification with financing access and highlighted key recommendations to strengthen Indonesia's ESCO ecosystem through certification, industry development, and financial sector capacity building.

The workshop concluded with a panel discussion moderated by Dan Valeriz from the ASEAN Centre for Energy (ACE), featuring Ar. Zulkifli Zahari, Ir. Ong Ching Loon, Mr. Seeley, and Dr. Robi Kurniawan from Indonesia's Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources (MEMR). The panellists highlighted that a strong regulatory framework, certified professionals, and institutional credibility are essential prerequisites for unlocking sustainable financing and accelerating ESCO market development. Dr. Robi also shared updates on Indonesia's newly enacted ESCO regulation and the upcoming Energy Efficiency Secretariat Incubator, while stressing the importance of establishing these enabling conditions before the GCF-KDB guarantee programme concludes.
